





is a short-term, customizable program for university students and professionals up to age 30. Participants can design exchanges that combine their professional goals with a humanitarian project.







### Sanibel Captiva Rotary Club Donates \$ 10,000 to Tornado Relief

On Sunday, January 16th of this year a tornado with winds up to 118 miles per hour touched down in the Iona area of Lee County, rendering many homes unlivable and injuring at least four people. Less than two weeks later the Sanibel Captiva Rotary Club issued the following press release.

he Rotary Club of Sanibel-Captiva recently donated \$10,000 to the tornado relief efforts in Ft. Myers. The funds came from donations from individual club members and the club's Trust Fund.


"One of our club's areas of focus is local crisis relief," said Bill Letendre, Club President. "The devastation caused by the recent tornados in Ft. Myers certainly qualifies. The victims of those storms are in dire straits and need all the help they can get. This is what Rotarians do...it's in our DNA."

The Sanibel-Captiva Rotary Club is leading the efforts of the clubs in Rotary District 6960 to raise funds for tornado relief. Through its Trust Fund, the club supports numerous local nonprofit organizations and national and international service projects, as well as emergency situations such as the recent tornados.

"The funds we distribute are primarily generated by the club's annual Arts and Crafts Festival held in February on Sanibel and by its annual Charity Cup Golf Tournament to be held this year in March," said Trust Chairman John Henshaw. "Community support for these two major fundraisers is essential to the club's philanthropic activities, as well as our local crisis relief efforts."

# Funds Raised at the Sanibel-Captiva Rotary Club's Arts & Crafts Festival and Charity Cup Golf Event Help People in Our Community and Around the World

With your help, we can do more to support those in need.

he Sanibel-Captiva Rotary Arts and Craft Festival is a major source of funds used to support those in need in and around our community and worthy causes worldwide. The major focus of Sanibel-Captiva Rotary Club and Rotary International center around charitable giving to projects that support local disaster relief efforts, aid to the handicapped and needy, medical research fighting disease, education and literacy, alleviating hunger and suffering for our neighbors with limited resources, access to quality care for mothers and children, need-based

financial assistance for post-secondary education for students at Florida universities and schools, and conservation efforts for wildlife and natural resources. In the last four years, the Sanibel-Captiva Rotary Club has raised over \$500,000. Through its Trust Fund Board, it has given out over \$40,000 in scholarships, \$200,000 to international charitable projects, and \$260,000 to local nonprofits. Some of these projects include:

**F.I.S.H. of Sanibel-Captiva, Inc.** to support those in need on Sanibel, Captiva, and the immediate area.

The Children's Education Center of the Islands (CECI), founded 46 years ago CECI is a local nonprofit cooperative preschool built upon the families and their need for their children to learn, grow, and find their place within the natural world.

**Bailey-Matthews National Shell Museum** connects people to the natural world through their love of shells and the animals that create them.

Community Housing and Resources, Inc. (CHR), a nonprofit organization with a mission is to provide affordable housing to families and individuals who work on or serve the community of Sanibel.

The Community House is the islands' "home" where friends and residents meet to socialize through

education, culture, events, and programs presented by the Sanibel Community Association.

**HANWASH Project** provides sustainable, lasting solutions for safe drinking water for people in Haiti.

**Casa Colibrí** to help the Mayan people of northwest Guatemala improve the quality of their lives through programs in health, education, and related infrastructure.



Miracles in Action, an organization to support select projects that achieve long-term results, improve quality of life, and allow truly impoverished people of Guatemala.

Partners for Breast Cancer Care, Inc. focused on saving lives and reducing the suffering from breast cancer through improved

early detection, education, and access to health care.

The Heights Center, established to help the teaching and learning environment for children and families in the Harlem Heights sections of Fort Myers.

**Hope Clubhouse of Southwest Florida, Inc.** supports adults living with mental illness.

The Wheelchair Foundation provides free wheelchairs to every child, teen, and adult worldwide who needs

one. Over the last four

years, through the Howard S. Danner Jr. Wheels for Wheels Cycling Challenge, the Sanibel-Captiva Rotary Club has provided over 890 wheelchairs to children, teens, and adults in Guatemala, Barbados, and Trinidad.

AdventHealth Foundation, Sharing Smiles Program to help fund the dental program in Tegucigalpa, Honduras.
